Our nomination for ANTI Contemporary Art Festival's International Live Art Prize in Kuopio, Finland was a total surprise and precipitous honour, the dizzying heights of which generated intoxicating/debilitating vertigo and the desire to jump into Lake Kallavesi and swim to the bottom and stay there. Congrats to Montreal's Dana Michel for winning the award and sparing us the anxiety of an acceptance speech.

We continued to work on *Everything Has Disappeared*, a collaboration with Winnipeg's Hazel Venzon. This project envisions envisions a day in which every Filipino person in the entire world suddenly vanishes. It's a project about work and the world.

But most importantly: WE ARE COMING HOME!!!

We are exploding with excitement about our newest venture: Face-to-Face In-Real-Life (F2F-IRL), which sees us seeding and developing new talent and projects in our home city of Toronto while hosting some of our international colleagues to offer talks, workshops and other professional development opportunities for the local artists.

F2F-IRL is focused on what performance does best: bringing people together face to face, creating understanding across differences, and popping the annoying and isolating echo-chamber bubbles causing such catastrophic cacophony all around us, allowing us to hear more than just the sound of our own voices. As beautiful as our own voices may be...

2019 has been a very interesting and successful year for Mammalian Diving Reflex.




We have continued our strong international presence while further developing and fostering fruitful relationships with international stakeholders.

Strengthen our presence in Toronto, Ontario and Canada by:

- Facilitating, supporting, and mentoring emerging local artists and producers.
- Network-sharing with peer organizations.
- Inviting international artists to showcase their unique practice.
- Seeding the creation of new work.

Develop The Last Minutes Before Mars, by:

- Continuing to build a production model and process that can be replicated in a variety of locales.
- Sourcing opportunities to present the work.
- Folding the work into our touring repertoire.

Consolidate our touring repertoire, by:

- Attending international arts markets to connect with new partners.
- Supporting international associates in their efforts to disseminate the work.
- Establishing international teams to pre-produce the work.
- Strengthening international teams to deliver the projects.

Maintain our international partnerships and networks, by:

- Deploying international teams at the earliest stage to conceive new work.
- Connecting with youth we have worked with through our longterm partnerships with Bochum Schauspielhaus (Germany) and ZONA K (Italy) and Triennale Milano Teatro's FOG Festival (Italy).
- Developing new work with our international friends, including Taiwan's Prototype Paradise and other partners, with a focus on the Asian Pacific.

YOUNG MAMMALS AROUND THE WORLD

Our Young Mammal ethos is spreading across the world like soft butter on a toasted bagel.

Mammalian has a deep history of long term engagement with young people, stretching back as far as 2006... In 2019, a few of the OG Young Mammals, The Torontonians, internationally toured with us on 50% of our projects. A special mention should go to Virginia Antonipillai, a Torontonian, who graduated from our teen-based projects to become the first Young Mammal on an *All the Sex I've Ever Had* tour!

Our German Young Mammals, Mit Ohn Alles, have been busy creating a ton of new work in Bochum, at both the Bochum Schausplielhaus and the Ruhrtriennale Festival, with a handful of these Young Mammals joining our international touring network.

We have also continued our Young Mammal long-term engagements with the UpLIFTers in London, U.K. and the ChamHULLeons in Hull, U.K., with the Milano Young Mammals being integral members in the creation and development of *The Last Minutes Before Mars*, which we detail later in the review, so give the page a cheeky turn and check it out!

NEW WORK DEVELOPMENT

THE LAST MINUTES BEFORE MARS

In October, we spent three weeks in Milan developing *The Last Minutes Before Mars*, a performance incorporating 360° video created in collaboration with students from ITAS Guilio Natta. Co-produced by Triennale Milano Teatro and ZONA K, *The Last Minutes Before Mars* is a performance about the exquisite boredom of life on Earth as we hurtle into a terrifying future. Following the world premiere in Germany at Schauspielhaus Bochum, we will be returning to Milan to present this other-worldly performance at Triennale Milano Teatro's FOG Festival. This project has been created with support from the Canada Council for the Art's Arts Abroad Co-Production grant.

EVERYTHING HAS DISAPPEARED

We have been working with longtime collaborator Hazel Venzon on *Everything Has Disappeared*, which presents a fictional reality where the world's Filipino population—many of whom are economic migrants working low-level service and care jobs in affluent areas around the world—suddenly one day simply disappear. Featuring the research of economists, demographers, sociologists and human geographers, *Everything Has Disappeared* examines the contribution of Filipino migrant labour to the world economy and the implications to our global structure should it suddenly vanish.

F2F-IRL

Face-to-Face In-Real-Life (F2F-IRL) is our freshest initiative in Toronto.

F2F-IRL creates opportunities for local Toronto-based performance and theatre artists to connect to each other, to us, and to the international artists we have developed relationships with over our past decade of international touring. We will create collaborative experiences within the Toronto theatre community using socially-engaged methods to inspire and nurture opportunities for a new generation of artists.


Currently we are working with five local artists and art collectives that are creating original new works that connect with marginalized and under-represented communities in fun, engaging and interactive ways. We have provided them with seed money for research and formed a study group that meets once a month to discuss our ideas and intentions, looking at tactile and practical ways to build the work, and offering dramaturgical support along the way.


In 2020, we will be actively working towards finding funding opportunities to bring international artists we admire to Toronto for cultural and artistic exchanges with our local community. We also plan to use our touring expertise to mentor an emerging artist or producer to shadow us on tour to learn about our socially engaged process.





FINANCIAL REPORT







FINANCIAL GOALS & VISION

We have invested significantly into creating an exceptional touring engine for our work in recent years, yielding accolades and international recognition. However, because of this, our financial and social investment into local Toronto projects needed a bit of a boost.

In 2020, our financial vision is for our total revenue to rely less on touring as we approach local community partnerships through corporate and private fundraising and individual donations to support our Toronto based work. This vision aligns with our Toronto reinvigoration and is summarized by these key financial goals:

- Decrease our reliance on touring grant revenue from 38% of total revenue to 29%.
- Sustain our performance fee revenue at 40% of total revenue.
- Increase our corporate and private fundraising and individual donation revenue from 1% of total revenue to 10%.

These goals could be pie in the sky, but we are determined to take a bite out of them and achieve what we have envisioned. We're Mammalians, remember? Been around for 150 millions years, plan on being here for at least 150 more.


